

Congratulations to Norman and his devoted owner for their outstanding achievement.


Cat Microchipping Laws 2024



Effective from the 10th of June 2024, it will be a legal obligation to have your cat microchipped. Failure to comply with this requirement could result in a significant fine of £500.

It is imperative not only to have your pet microchipped but also to ensure that your contact details are regularly updated. This ensures that in the unfortunate event of your pet going missing, they can be promptly reunited with you. At our practice, we offer microchipping services at a cost of £21.50.
